YOUTH LIVESTOCK SHOWMANSHIP

Animals must be owned, fitted & entered by youth livestock exhibitor. Advance entries not needed. Exhibitors must be ready to show when they are called. Only the top two showmen of the Intermediate Class will be eligible to move to the Senior Class. Exhibitors must show in the proper age division.

4-H SHOWMANSHIP – Age on Jan. 1 of show year

NOVICE: Exhibitors 9 & 10 years old or first year of showing

JUNIOR: Exhibitors 11 & 12 years old

INTERMEDIATE: Exhibitors 13 & 14 years old

SENIOR: Exhibitors 15 years and up

INDEPENDENT EXHIBITOR: 9-17 years old on Jan 1, 2017. He or she must provide a picture of the animal, ownership proof, tag/tattoo information prior to Fair. Independent exhibitors must be supervised by a responsible adult. Members of FFA & 4-H are not eligible to compete as independents.

All youth exhibitors must own their animals prior to Fair as follows: dairy, sheep, swine, market & pet goats, 60 consecutive days; beef & dairy replacement does, 120 consecutive days.

DAIRY REPLACEMENT HEIFER SALE

11 A.M. SATURDAY, AUGUST 29

The Replacement Heifer Project, begun in 1969, enables members to raise top quality dairy heifers selected for milk production. The heifers are obtained with the cooperation of local dairymen. They are all offspring of top individual cows in their herds and are sired by top genetic potential bulls. Their dams must have a minimum Relative Herd Value of 110%. Our dairymen sell these heifers to help dairy youth. This project's sale feature allows members who have no facilities for milking cows to raise and sell dairy heifers. A grand champion and reserve champion will be selected after the Youth Dairy Show judging. Exhibitors of grand champion and reserve champion may sell another animal in the Junior Livestock Auction. **AMERICAN AgCREDIT** sponsors awards of \$200 & \$100. After the sale, heifers may be led to hauling vehicles in the field off California St. **NO VEHICLES WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS FOR LOADING AFTER THIS AUCTION.**

These does are American or Purebred dairy goats, certified CAE negative, provided through the cooperation of Northern California dairy goat breeders. Goats must be shown in Div. 430 to sell. Please specify sale animal on entry form. Exhibitors of grand champion and reserve champion may sell another animal in the Junior Livestock Auction.
