Unfit items will be removed and may result in disqualification of auction.**

One item containing the vegetable should be included.

Fair will collect 10% commission on items sold.

Exhibitor must attend mandatory auction meeting on Friday, August 24th at 6pm in front of livestock office and be present at the auction on Saturday, August 26th at 2pm in the Judging Pavilion

Auction participants must have a thank you card checked off by auction coordinator before receiving check
